A "CNC plasma" system is a machine that carries a plasma torch and can move that torch in a path directed by a computer. The term "CNC" refers to "Computer Numerical Control", which means that a computer is used to direct the machine's motion based on numerical codes in a program.

Using the CNC plasma system Clyde can make "just about anything" out of flat metal. He makes signs, home décor and functional repair materials. Clyde enjoys collaborating with his customers and making projects that fit their personalities and lifestyles. He is capable of also making metal items that are needed for equipment repair. "Just bring in your part and I can make it happen", says Clyde.

One of my favorite items that I came across while visiting with Clyde is a jet that he cut and designed to hold his Airforce medals. It is designed to present medals so that you can see them both front and back. He plans to use this idea for anyone who needs a special way to show off their achievements.

Clyde loves his business and is happy he gets to utilize his creative outlet and set his own hours. He has big goals for the future of Patriot's Landing, as he plans on

eventually expanding his business and obtaining more fabrication tools to make bending and other jobs easier.
